ASSISTED LIVING OPTIONS

Community Based Residential Facilities (CBRF)

A facility where five or more adults reside who are not related to the operator or administrator, do not require care above intermediate level nursing care but receive services that are above the level of room & board, including but not limited to, assistance with bathing, toileting, mobility, nutrition, etc. with **no limit** on the number of hours for personal care services. They cannot provide more than **3 hours** of **skilled nursing i.e. RN/LPN**, care per week per resident. CBRFs can range in size from 5 to 257 beds & may be private or public, for-profit or not-for-profit, but all must be licensed under Wisconsin DHS Administrative Code.

Residential Care Apartment Complexes (RCAC)

A facility where five or more adults reside that consists of **independent** apartments, each with an individual lockable entrance and exit. Each must have a kitchen, including a stove (or microwave oven); & individual bathroom, sleeping & living areas. Services offered could include housekeeping, laundry, bathing, meals, etc. RCACs are limited to providing **no more** than 28 hours per week **total** of services to each resident. Some apartment communities identified as an RCAC through Wisconsin DHS may be a combination of completely independent residents & those that do use *services offered* that they need. RCACs can be a stand alone facility but may also be a physically defined & distinct part of a structure that is a skilled nursing home or CBRF.

ELDER ABUSE REPORTING ADULTS AT RISK REPORTING

PURPOSE:

To respond to reports of those who suffer from physical, mental, financial or self-abuse/neglect and determine if there is a need for direct services, a referral to law enforcement or bring a petition for guardianship and/or protective services.

Elder Adult at Risk – a person who is age 60 or older who is experiencing or at risk of experiencing abuse, neglect, self-neglect or financial exploitation.

Adult at Risk – any adult who has a physical or mental condition that substantially impairs his/her ability to care for his/her needs and is experiencing or at risk of experiencing abuse, neglect, self-neglect or financial exploitation.

EVIDENCE-BASED PREVENTION CLASSES

“Living Well with Chronic Conditions”

Purpose: To help older adults become better self-managers of their chronic conditions. Workshop is sponsored only once a year by Fond du Lac County Senior Services Dept.

Classes include: Classes are highly participative, where mutual support and success builds participants’ confidence in their ability to manage their ongoing health condition.

In the *Living Well with Chronic Conditions* Workshop you will:

- Find practical ways to deal with pain and fatigue.
- Discover better nutrition and exercise choices.
- Understand new treatment choices.
- Learn better ways to talk with your doctor and family about your health.

If you have conditions such as diabetes, arthritis, heart disease, chronic pain, or anxiety, the *Living Well* Workshop can help you take charge of your life.

Length of class: Workshop is held once a week for six consecutive weeks for 2 ½ hours. Attendance at all 6 classes is recommended. The dates will be announced.

EVIDENCE-BASED PREVENTION CLASSES

“Stepping On”

Purpose: To help older adults lessen the risk of falling. *Stepping On* classes are held for 2 hours per week for 7 weeks. Information is provided about safe footwear, light exercises to improve strength & balance, safety while out & about, how vision affects falls, medication management, research on Vitamin D & calcium & much more.

Eligibility: Class members must be at least 60 years of age & reside in their own home or apartment. Participants must be able to stand & walk on their own. Cognitively be able to understand the class.

“Healthy Living with Diabetes”

Healthy Living with Diabetes (HLWD) is a high-level evidence-based workshop for people who have diabetes. Developed at Stanford University, the *Healthy Living with Diabetes* workshop meets for 2-1/2 hours once a week for six weeks. This community-based program is very interactive, where mutual support and success build participants’ confidence in their ability to manage their health condition and maintain active and fulfilling lives. It is facilitated by two trained leaders in a small group setting, and most of the learning comes from sharing and helping others in the workshop with similar challenges.

Who should take it?

Workshops are best for anyone who:

- Has, or lives with someone who has, diabetes (Type 2, Pre, or Type 1)
- Is living in a home or apartment; and
- Is not suffering from dementia

FAMILY CARE PROGRAMS

PURPOSE:

Family Care has three major organizational components:

1. Aging and Disability Resource Centers (ADRC), designed to be a single entry point where older people and people with disabilities and their families can get information and advice about a wide range of resources available to them in their local community.
2. Managed Care Organizations (MCO's), manage and provide services tailored to each individual's needs, circumstances and preferences.
3. IRIS is a Medicaid long-term support, self-directed program in which you make your own decisions about your life, including how to spend your days and the types of support/assistance you need.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Must first contact the Aging and Disability Resource Center for information, assessment and options counseling
- Must be in the primary target group of frail, elderly, people with disabilities or people with developmental disabilities
- Must meet functional and financial eligibility
- Must be a resident of Fond du Lac County
- Is a voluntary program

COST:

Some people may have a cost share for services based on financial eligibility

**FAMILY CAREGIVER SUPPORT PROGRAM
OF FOND DU LAC COUNTY
(NFCSP – National Family Caregiver Support Program)**

PURPOSE:

To provide information and assistance to caregivers about available services. For those family caregivers that meet eligibility requirements, some funding may be available to assist with in-home respite care, adult day service costs or short term (overnight) respite at a care facility.

ELIGIBILITY:

1. A family member living with, and caring for:
 - An individual age 60 or older that meets the definition of “frail” as defined by the Older Americans Act, or
 - An individual with Alzheimer’s disease or other form of dementia

2. Grandparents or relative caregivers 55 years of age and older but not the child’s parent, who live with and provide the primary care for:
 - Children under age 19, or
 - A relative with a disability who is 19 to 59 years of age

COST:

No cost and not dependent on household income.
Participants may donate.

Those enrolled in Wisconsin’s FAMILY CARE program (see pg. 25) are not eligible.

Home Health Care is predominantly intermittent **skilled** nursing care certified by a physician to be medically necessary. It is provided in a home setting to a *homebound* person. Services may also include speech, occupational and physical therapy. Could possibly include home health aide services, i.e. bathing assistance, only if other skilled services are physician ordered. The following providers are **Certified** for Medicare, Medicaid programs as well as some private/commercial insurance plans. Some may also be certified for Veterans Administration. Patients can also privately pay for services.
