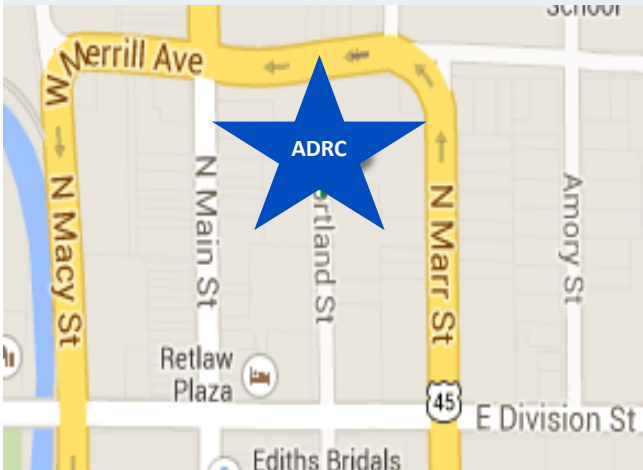

What is an ADRC?

The ADRC is **the first place to go** for resources related to aging or living with a disability. We provide unbiased information and options available to help individuals make informed choices at no cost regardless of income. The ADRC is wheel-chair accessible and interpreters are provided at no cost to consumers.

Who Does ADRC Serve?

We provide information and assistance to help older adults, individuals with disabilities, their families and caregivers find services and resources to keep them living well and independently.

Our information and assistance is free and completely confidential. Some services are based on program eligibility and available on a limited basis. Whether there are private or public resources needed, we are here to provide information and options available to stay in your home or community safely.

Long Term Care Options Counseling

Free, confidential consultation about options for help in your home, or residential care options. Information about what funding programs people may be eligible for including screening for functional eligibility for publicly funded Long Term Care programs.

Youth Transition

Information and Assistance beginning at age 17.5 years old for youth with physical or developmental/intellectual disabilities transitioning into adult services. Information regarding benefits and services that may be available based on disability and functional abilities.

Health and Wellness
