- 3) Health insurance does not cover selected vaccines
- 4) Are American Indian or Alaska Native

Consumer's Guide to Services



SERVICES WE OFFER:

HIV Testing – Confidential HIV antibody counseling and testing provided by appointment.

TB Skin Testing – Testing for tuberculosis available on M, T, W, F by appointment for a fee of \$15.00 per test.

Public Health Nursing Visits – Provided to families, pregnant women, new mothers and individuals with chronic illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease and cancer.

Blood Pressure Screening – Conducted on a walk-in basis Monday - Friday, 8:30 am – 4:00 pm.

Public Health Nursing Visits to Schools – Regular visits are provided; yearly-vision & hearing screening provided to all schools on a voluntary basis.

Health Education – Provided to groups upon request.

Refugee Services – Provides health screening, immunizations and referral to a primary care provider and dentist for newly arriving refugees and asylees.

Pregnancy Testing – Available free of charge by appointment or on a walk-in basis.

Developmental Screening – Free Ages and Stages questionnaires are available for parents to complete for children age 2 months through 5 years. The questionnaires are scored and follow-up is provided as needed.


WIC Program – WIC (Women, Infants, Children) provides supplemental nutritious foods, nutrition & breastfeeding information, and referral to other health services for income eligible pregnant, breastfeeding women, infants, and children until age five. WIC promotes and supports breastfeeding.

Prenatal Care Coordination – Provides services of assessment, care plan development, care coordination and education to Medicaid-eligible pregnant women with a high risk for adverse pregnancy outcomes. Visits are provided by a Maternal Child Health nurse.

Childhood Lead Screening – Information on the risks of lead poisoning in children is available, along with blood lead testing if needed. Environmental assessments are provided for children with reported elevated blood lead readings.

Oral Health – Save a Smile Dental Program provides access to dental care for FDL County residents 18 years and younger, with Medical Assistance



insurance. Save a Smile also assists adults with urgent dental needs.

Sexual Health Clinic - Offer screening and testing for Gonorrhea and Chlamydia, treatment for positive results, expedited partner therapy, and education on prevention of sexually transmitted diseases. Call to make an appointment.

Tobacco Prevention & Control Coalition – Promotes youth tobacco prevention efforts, provides up-to-date information on tobacco & nicotine products. Fee-exempt private well water testing is available for families with pregnant women or infants under the age of one year.*

Radon Information Center (RIC) – Radon is a naturally occurring, odorless, colorless radioactive gas that can cause lung cancer. The RIC provides technical consultation on the measurement and mitigation of radon gas in homes. Test kits—long term (\$23) and short term (\$10)— are available at the Health Dept.*

Medical Equipment Loan Closet – Limited number of walkers, commodes, and wheelchairs, etc., are available on a short-term basis at no cost.
